Pastors' Letter

Dear Advent Friends,

Last week Chris preached on Luke 10:38-42. This gospel lesson presents a question for all of us to answer. "Is it better to be Mary or Martha?" In this scripture Jesus makes a visit to the home of Martha and Mary. During the visit we see Martha working hard in the kitchen, while her sister Mary visits with Jesus in the parlor. Martha complains to Jesus that her sister is a slacker. Jesus responds by saying, "Mary has chosen the better part."

Jesus' words are a reminder that we sometimes get too busy doing, instead of being. We tend to get preoccupied with serving God, and we forget to take time to know God better. Mary, the one in the parlor with Jesus, wanted to sit at her Lord's feet and visit, and listen, and learn. That's our dilemma, is it not? We sometimes get so busy we miss opportunities to learn or even pray. When that happens, we miss opportunities for God to release his power in our lives. All through the Old and New Testaments we see the theme of God wanting to share his resources with us. But, for this to happen, we need to slow down and spend quality time in prayer with God.

In his book "Too Busy Not To Pray," Bill Hybles reflects on the necessity to pray and to sit down just to "be" with God. Otherwise our walk with Jesus

may slow to a crawl. We may simply go through the motions of being a vital Christian. We need to be ready to pay whatever price it takes so that we may have an authentic walk with our God. Like Mary, we have to step out of our routine schedules and into the presence of our God. Bill Hybles discovered that such a walk with the Lord demanded his full attention. He said, "I'm going to pay whatever price it takes for an authentic walk with Jesus Christ." He found out that this required work, but it changed his life.

Each of us at Advent should do the same. Why not take the rest of July and August just to enter the presence of God in prayer. Before all the programming begins for a new year, let's just relax in the presence of God. Let's take more time than usual to read God's word, and let nothing distract us from hearing God speak. Our hope would be that these actions would move us into deeper intimacy with our Lord. That's what we are here for. See you in worship.
